Love gardening? The NH Master Gardener Program is part of a national effort to train people who are passionate about gardening so that they can become volunteers who share science-based horticultural knowledge with the public.

You'll Learn:

- basic botany and plant physiology
- soil science and ecology
- entomology
- plant pathology
- horticultural research
- various gardening techniques
- adult learning strategies
- project management
- public speaking

After completing the 12-week training, participants will:

- complete a 55-hour internship to become a Master Gardener
- maintain an annual commitment of 20 hours of volunteer time and 10 hours of continuing education

Volunteers fulfill their commitment in various ways:

- responding to questions through the UNH Extension Education Center Infoline
- providing garden-related talks to community groups
- working on educational gardens in schools, nature centers, museums, community gardens, health care facilities and more.

Apply: Participants must submit an application and be interviewed prior to acceptance. Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis beginning December 20, 2019 until the program is full. Space is limited.
